**WHAT IS POWDER HORN?**

*Powder Horn is a skills resource course for **Venturing (Advisors and youth leaders), Scouting leaders and youth (age 16 and up)**, a "hands-on resource management course" designed to introduce participants to activities and resources necessary to conduct an awesome high adventure program and give Scouting leaders in their unit. The goals of Powder Horn are*

- *Help Scout leaders safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature.*
- *Introduce resources to help successfully lead youth through a program of high adventure.*
- *Familiarize participants with the skills involved in different high adventure disciplines.*
- *Provide the requirements for the Venturing Scout Ranger Award.*

Its purpose is to educate adult Scouters and youth about the specific high adventure skills, to connect them to the resources to deliver those skills and keep them excited about delivering those skills in a challenging way to youth. It is not designed to be a personal development program, team building experience nor to provide specific skills certifications.

*Powder Horn presents a wide variety of hands-on high adventure skills experiences, Participants will leave with a list of ideas to help their program, along with the contacts and resources needed to implement them. Here are the proposed programs:*

**Caving – Cooking - COPE & Climbing - Conservation - Cycling - First Aid  
Fishing - Land Navigation - Leave No Trace - Outdoor Living History  
SCUBA - Search & Rescue - Shooting Sports – Water Sports - Wilderness Survival**

Participants are not required to participate in an activity that they are uncomfortable with, however to earn the Powder Horn medal, the participant must complete at least 10 of the above course sessions.
